MATH

GREEN Book (Math 1):

We will wrap up place value patterns Monday. We will then explore problem solving and rounding whole numbers and decimals. We will also complete our diagnostic checkpoint that we did not get to last week.

BLUE Book (Math 2 and 3):

We started multiplying decimals on Friday. This week we will continue to work on multiplying and dividing decimals. We will learn the divisibility rules and how to apply them. Towards the end of next week will be the second part of our test.

Social Studies

Overall, the students did awesome on their first social studies test. They will be getting them back on Monday.

This week we will complete lessons 1 and 2 in our social studies book. We will complete the vocabulary cards for the chapter and review them daily. We will discuss the various ethnic groups that make up our country and our responsibilities and rights as citizens.
